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Overview

Norbert the Norwegian Ridgeback and Detention

Hagrid secretly hatches a dragon egg, naming the baby dragon Norbert. Keeping a dragon is illegal, so Harry, Ron, and Hermione help Hagrid arrange for Norbert to be taken away. They are caught out of bed by Professor McGonagall, resulting in detention in the Forbidden Forest with Hagrid, where they encounter a mysterious, cloaked figure drinking unicorn blood.

Through the Trapdoor

Convinced Snape is about to steal the Stone, Harry, Ron, and Hermione decide to retrieve it first. They navigate a series of magical challenges guarding the trapdoor: Fluffy, Devil's Snare, flying keys, a giant chess game, a troll (already defeated), and a logic puzzle involving potions. Ron sacrifices himself in the chess game, allowing Harry and Hermione to continue.

The Man with Two Faces

Harry reaches the final chamber alone, expecting to find Snape, but instead discovers Professor Quirrell, the Defense Against the Dark Arts teacher. Quirrell reveals he was the one trying to steal the Stone for Lord Voldemort, who has been living as a parasitic entity on the back of Quirrell's head. Harry defeats Quirrell by touching him, as Quirrell cannot bear Harry's mother's love-protection, and the Stone is saved.
